



Global Citizen Program Medallion Project

The Global Citizen Program is administered by the SPC Center for International Programs (CIP) and showcases students as global citizens. The Medallion Project for the GCP is an opportunity for the student to demonstrate the skills, knowledge, and attitudes of a student who is prepared to enter an interconnected world of diverse cultures and perspectives.

For the Medallion project, the student will:

1. Choose an international, intercultural, or global topic upon which to focus
 - a. Topic approved by CIP Director and a Faculty Mentor
 - i. Student conveys to CIP director choice of Faculty Mentor
 - ii. CIP confers with and confirms availability of Faculty Mentor
 - b. Topic can be interdisciplinary and can focus on such as a political crisis, cultural misunderstanding, environmental concern, or civic engagement with international group
 - c. Must be topic that can demonstrate student's
 - i. Knowledge of a particular culture, as well as understanding of how that particular culture influences the entire global community.
 - ii. Skill in ability to engage with diverse groups and/or individuals
 - iii. Attitude which embraces and respects diverse views
2. Present your Medallion project – can be in any of the following ways:
 - a. Submit a five to seven page paper describing the project to CIP Director & Faculty Mentor
 - b. Do a 20 minute presentation about your project to an SPC or Community group (CIP to assist in finding group and/or scheduling)
 - c. Submit a multimedia presentation for electronic viewing
3. Once presentation is completed, upload medallion project into student ePortfolio
