By the sea is the walled Old Town founded in the 16th century with squares, cobblestone streets, and colorful colonial buildings. Cartagena is home to UNESCO's World Heritage Site *Castillo San Felipe* which is one of Colombia's most famous and formidable sites. The colonial-era castle, built in 1536 is known as the most impregnable fortress ever built by the Spanish in the Americas
