Communication and Response Times

Both students and instructors will use the Email tool in the Communicate menu in My Courses. Please send your instructor any questions you may have about the course as it proceeds. Discussion forums and essay responses will be returned with feedback and grades within 1-3 days after the deadline. Working ahead is not recommended because this is not a self-paced course, and some assignments require collaboration and communication with your classmates.

Netiquette:

When communicating on the Internet, it is essential to observe certain rules of behavior. Effective communications are governed by netiquette (internet etiquette). Netiquette refers to rules of behavior governing the use of all internet services, including communicating with discussion groups, creation of web pages, and connecting to FTP and telnet sites. Some of the basic rules of e-mail netiquette include the following:

1. Never say anything you don't want made public. Think before you post a message. Always make sure you really want to send what you have written. Messages may easily be forwarded or saved for retrieval later. E-mail messages are not secure. Most organizations archive all e-mail messages that pass through their servers. Messages may also be intercepted en route.
2. Don't post to discussions or use e-mail when you are emotional. If you are angry, you can sound abusive or threatening. Be careful when expressing humor and sarcasm because it can be misinterpreted. With most systems, you can't get the message back after you click the send button.
3. Do not use emoticons to express emotion. Emoticons can appear in many different ways depending on the software interface. Use your words carefully and professionally.

If an attachment cannot be opened, students will be required to re-save and re-submit an assignment so it can be evaluated and returned.

Minimum Technical Skills: To succeed in the course, you must be able (at minimum) to: (1) know how to use a computer and internet; (2) know how to open basic files; (3) know how to use a computer keyboard; (4) know how to use e mail; (5) know how to compose essays using a word processing program (like WORD, etc.).
